

SKÅDE SCHOOL

With a focus on play and exercise, Rosan Bosch has created an Activity Park by Skåde School in Århus that combines play, sports and imagination and which presents a range of new means for exercise and display – in a fun and challenging way. At the same time, the alternative Activity Park becomes a place where it is natural to gather and stay, and becomes in that way a new meeting place in public space – for old and young alike.

The Activity Park has been executed for 'The Danish Foundation for Culture and Sports Facilities' in connection to Skåde School in Århus, and is characterised by being a dynamic activity area where different types of exercise and play meet, and as a place that encourages to physical activity. The Activity Park is a reinterpretation of the idea of a multi-track as a place that encourages to physical exercise in different ways and which attracts people in all age groups with a range of different means for activity such as parkour, climbing walls and artistic trees and cubes for playing and climbing. The entire area is merged into one park and different types of exercise and social activity therefore arise between the different functions – a multi-track in combination with seating areas for social interaction and activity areas for play and exercise.

In the project there has been a special focus on also creating means of activity for girls as well as areas that accommodate smaller children's way of playing and exercising – at Skåde School's Activity Park there is room for everybody across all ages and genders.
